Moran: Things Better at Gitmo

Washington - Virginia Congressman Jim Moran says conditions at the Guantanamo Bay prison where terror suspects are being held have substantially improved.

Moran thinks there's "no question" that when members of Congress visit the facility they're getting the "sanitized version" but he believes the alleged abusive interrogations taking place there a few years ago are no longer happening.

Moran spent Monday at the Cuban facility with D.C. Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton and Virginia Congressman Tom Davis. Moran says they listened in on at least two interrogations.

Some 520 terror suspects remain detained at Guantanamo. Moran says 234 prisoners were released.
