## **Kuwait Times: Release of Kuwaiti prisoner imminent.**

KUWAIT: Kuwait is ready to receive the Kuwaiti prisoner Nasser Al-Mutairi who is still kept in Guantanamo prison in Cuba. According to Khalid Al-Odah, head of the Kuwaiti Family Committee "it wasn't settled yet when Al-Mutairi would come back exactly. But our security delegation is ready as well as the Kuwaiti plane which will carry the national home. We are just waiting to get the permission from the administration in Guantanamo." After getting the permission, the Kuwaiti plane will land on Guantanamo for few hours only. Al-Odah noted, "the Kuwaiti plane will leave Guantanamo as soon as the security delegation receives Al-Mutairi. It is a matter of few hours and not days to receive the prisoner, and he will come back to his country." The Kuwaiti prisoner who suffered from diseases before is physically well at the present time. "Al-Mutairi had tough times especially after the operations he had to make. But now he is much better and he lives a normal life," stated Al-Odah.

Human rights institutions made several reports about violation of human rights by the American administration with the prisoners in Guantanamo. Al-Odah said, "we heard so many reports that talked about the abuse that the prisoners in general face in Guantanamo prison with no details. Yet, we heard lately about a report that was presented by the FBI that gave details about the abuse and violation of human rights that the prisoners face in that terrible prison. This proves what we said earlier that the United States is not dealing with these prisoners in a humanitarian way." "I appeal to the White House to start a real investigation about all what happens in the terrible prison in Guantanamo, especially after receiving this report from the FBI that is considered to be an American institution at the time this country is violating all the human rights in Guantanamo as well as in other prisons," stated Al-Odah.

The Kuwaiti lawyers left Kuwait Sunday to Guantanamo to meet the Kuwaiti prisoners. Al-Odah said, "our lawyers will meet our prisoners there to discuss their situation, as well as to know all the details about what happened with these Kuwaiti prisoners. In the next week, we will be able to know all the details about our prisoners in Guantanamo, and I hope that the Kuwaiti Government would be able to release them as well from that horrible prison."
